## Workbook Instructions

### Tools

The Steering Committee will use (2) basic tools in order to update the 2003 Town & City of Platteville Comprehensive Plan:

- Community Survey
- Workbooks

### Workbooks

The 2003 Comprehensive Plan has been divided into a (9) workbooks:

1. Issues & Opportunities
2. Housing
3. Agriculture, Natural, & Cultural Resources
4. Economic Development
5. Transportation
6. Utilities & Community Facilities
7. Intergovernmental Cooperation
8. Land Use
9. Implementation

Each workbook was developed from the 2003 Comprehensive Plan. The text in black ink is general information that should be reviewed for spelling and grammatical errors. Specific questions to be answered will be numbered.

Text in **blue** ink is a specific question that needs to be answered. Text in **red** ink is a specific question that needs to be answered that was recommended to be changed thru the Scoping Survey (conducted by the Steering Committee in August 2008). Most of the questions require one of the following:

- Keep, as is.                       Eliminate                       Modify (write below)

### Subcommittees & Chairpersons

The steering committee will ask for one person to chair each of the (7) subcommittees to complete workbooks 2-9. Because the first and last chapters of the comprehensive plan provide direction and summarize all the content of the plan, a committee of the (7) chairpersons will work together on the Issues & Opportunities workbook and the Implementation workbook.

### Stakeholders

Each subcommittee chairperson will assemble a committee of interested parties to complete their respected workbooks. Chairpersons are encouraged to recruit those individuals that adequately represent the diversity of opinion and thought.

### Reporting

The chairperson from each subcommittee will present their completed workbooks to the Steering Committee on September 9<sup>th</sup>.
